## Facility Description

RMOTC offers the following facilities:

- Drilling & Service Rigs
- Administrative Services, Engineers, Scientists, & Support Staff
- Support Equipment
- Bio-Treatment Facilities
- Soil Remediation Facilities
- Field Laboratory with surface outcrops of Cretaceous fluvial and marine units
- Gas Processing Facilities
- Production Facilities
- Tanks & Pipelines
- Aquaculture & Hydroponics Greenhouse Facilities

- Subsurface dataset including a modern 3D seismic survey

## Experience

RMOTC has experience operating a working oil field, complete with oil production facilities, a gas plant, and transportation systems, along with the land, equipment, and the practical and technical experience of its staff to help clients simulate real world scenarios.

General oil field knowledge courses have been offered over a one week period with 10-15 people at a time. For example, RMOTC has provided training to Native American Tribe members in basic petroleum operations.

RMOTC also has an extensive Outreach program offered to secondary education in the region. Students from high schools and middle schools are regular visitors to the RMOTC Science Center, where they experiment with the feasibility of raising aquaculture and agricultural crops in untreated oil field produced water.

Casper College utilizes the Field Laboratory, where geologic and paleontologic studies are performed in the field, facilitating real-world educational experience for students.

RMOTC sponsors the annual Science Bowl competition every winter, pitting high-school teams from around the state to demonstrate their knowledge in math, physics, chemistry, astronomy, geology, and biology.

Local and regional emergency agencies such as police and fire departments conduct field drills and tests of emergency response plans. And oil field “wild well control” service companies train personnel on blowout control and fire suppression procedures.
